

Let's Walk Bishopston

Horfield Common (SE corner) to St Andrews Park



A gentle linear walk on pavements, linking two well-established parks in Horfield and Bishopston. Mainly on side roads; the stretch along busy Gloucester Road is on a wide pavement.

Distance: 1 mile / 1.6 km Allow: About 30 minutes Suitability: Easy access for walkers and wheelchairs.

- 1. START: the south-east corner of Horfield Common, where two paths meet by the exit to Ash Road. Walk down Ash Road, crossing Maple Road and later Oak Road, to reach Gloucester Road.
- **2.** Turn right and walk along the right hand pavement, crossing Thornleigh Road and Radnor Road, until you reach a broad pavement area just before Longmead Avenue.
- **3.** Cross Gloucester Road at the zebra crossing and continue ahead along the right hand pavement of Nevil Road. After the Brynland Road junction, the road bends gently to the right; continue ahead to the next road junction at Mervyn Road.
- **4.** At the Mervyn Road junction, cross diagonally to the left and continue walking along the left-hand side of Nevil Road, crossing Kennington Road to reach the end of Nevil Road with the Cricket Club gates in front of you.

- **5.** Walk past the gates and continue along the left hand pavement, firstly in Kent Road which soon bends to the left, then continuing ahead along Lancashire Road (as Kent Road bends right.)
- **6.** Continue along the left hand side of Surrey Road, following the pavement round the corner into Derby Road. Keep walking along the left hand side of Derby Road. A short distance beyond the convenience store, the pavement crosses Sefton Park Road at a raised speed table and, just beyond this, Happy Lane.
- **7.** At the bend, pause and look ahead at the view over St Andrews Park towards Redland. Continue ahead to Sommerville Road; immediately to the left is a zebra crossing, which you use to enter St Andrews Park, your destination.
